

#### Critical errors

A critical error is a serious driving error that doesn't result in immediate danger to any road user or property. If you make more than one critical error in stage 1 (first 10 mins) of the test, you fail the test. If you make **more than two critical errors** over the whole test, you also fail.

- Too slow 10k under limit, or too slow to act.
- Mounting a kerb one wheel mounts the kerb when parking or 3 point turn.
- **Too fast** 5–10 km/h over the speed limit for less than 5 seconds.
- Stalling the vehicle.
- Failing to look at intersection, or fail to do mirror and head check.
- Incomplete stop at a Stop sign.
- Failing to signal.
- Blocking a pedestrian crossing.
- Other illegal action.

#### Immediate fail errors

An immediate fail error is any driving which results in another road user having to take evasive action or an immediate danger to any road user or property. These result in immediate failure of the test.

- Requires Testing Officer intervention.
- Excessive speed over the speed limit by 5km/h for 5 seconds or more or 10km/h.
- Failing to carry out an instruction.
- Stopping at dangerous position on a railway crossing or blocking an intersection.
- Collision with kerb or object.
- Failing to stop at stop sign or lights.
- Failing to give way.
- Other dangerous action.

# Before the test day – Vehicle checklist 🗸

The Testing Officer will do a safety check of your car. You must check all this off before you go for your test, even if you're borrowing someone else's car. Some people fail their licence test without even getting out on the road because their car isn't fit to go.



L plates



RUC (if diesel car)



Make sure passenger seat is clean



Current WOF



Know where demister, wipers and horn are



Enough fuel for a 45 minute drive



Current rego



Check tyres have sufficient tread (no space saver tyres are fitted)



Check indicator/ brake lights (including high stop lights) are all working

## On test day – checklist



Take learner licence



Arrive early at least 30 mins before



Take glasses if you wear them



Report and wait inside the testing agent (not in your car)

# When you get your restricted licence



No passengers (unless you are accompanied by a supervisor).

There are some automatic exemptions\* (for spouse or children)



Take your licence with you whenever you are driving



No driving between 10pm & 5am (unless you are accompanied by a supervisor)



Zero alcohol limit for under 20s
